FUNDING THE CHARITABLE PURPOSE

At our recent July general meeting, all members received a copy of the recently released RSL NSW policy document, SOP1 - FUNDING THE CHARITABLE PURPOSE, that sets out the new procedures for sub-branches to follow when giving donations to charitable initiatives.

Initially the document is confronting.

Fourteen pages of legal definitions, explanatory notes, governing principles, new procedures! Enough to make your head spin but relax. It is all quite simple. Here are the basics.

- From now on, all donations a sub-Branch may wish to make must first be submitted to the District Presidents' Council.
- If approved, the funds are deposited in the Veterans Support Fund (VSF) and distributed from there.

These changes are necessary because some sub-Branches, including our own, have made donations that are contrary to the governance standards set by the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission (ACNC).


Rule Number 1: Every charity must be not-forprofit and must stick to its charitable purpose, in our case, veterans and their families. Why? Because if you raise money for veterans and then spend it on something else, no matter how worthy that something else may be, you are deceiving the public and bringing your charity into disrepute.

Rule Number 2: Every charity must comply with Australian laws and ensure that any donation is transparent and that conflicts of interest have been identified and managed.

Rule Number 3: Responsible people in a charity have a duty to act with standards of integrity and common sense.

The new system for donations from sub-Branches will enable RSL NSW to maintain high standards of governance across sub-Branches.

The Veterans Support Fund initiatives and targets will be published and this will be valuable information for sub-Branches preparing their budgets. The VSF will also provide funds for immediate emergency relief


